Cell Phones or other electronic devices

Jewelry (other than studs in ears)

Knives or weapons of any kind Fireworks
Matches, lighters, or candles Sandals

Razors/Shaving items Roller Blades/Skateboards/Bikes

Make-up Hair Spray/Hair Dryer/Curling Iron/Straightener

Pets Perfume or Cologne (attracts bugs)
Insect repellant or sunscreen (camp will provide) Candy/Snacks/Gum (attracts wildlife)

Medications (other than prescribed)

Disposable cameras
